The previous notice identified that three employees had signs or symptoms of an illness and were encouraged to do COVID-19 testing. They were required to stay at home for a minimum of 10 days. One of those employees did test positive. We are certain that the illness was acquired from being out in the community. This staff member is not a direct care giver with no known exposure to residents.

We continue to screen all employees before and after their shifts. They are required to wear their face masks while inside the building and other PPE when working with residents. The facility is also scheduling a surveillance test for all employees during the upcoming weeks.

Cases of the Corona Virus have greatly increased in the county and across the country. It is extremely important that everyone continues to social distance, wear face masks and practice good hand hygiene.
